

Native American / American Indian Education Eligibility



Eligibility Is Not Based Upon Any Minimum Blood Quantum.

The Long Beach Unified School District is currently funded by the United States Department of Education to operate a supplementary educational program for students of Native American/American Indian descent in adherence of Title VII - the Indian Education Act. Funding for this program is based upon the total number of students within our district who are known to be of Native American/American Indian descent.

If you are aware of ANY Native American/American Indian ancestry in your family background, your student(s) may be eligible for additional educational opportunities. Tribal enrollment is not necessary to participate. **Please complete the Title VII Student Eligibility Certificate and return it to the Title VII Indian Education Office. EONA/Special Projects, 1515 Hughes Way, Long Beach, CA 90810 (Mailing Address).**

Please indicate on the Title VII Student Eligibility Certificate any tribal ancestry of which you are aware. Even though you may not wish your student to actively participate in the program, your signature will benefit other Native American students in the district. Please be aware that all information supplied will be regarded as strictly confidential. Please contact the Title VII Indian Education Office if you have any questions or concerns.
