APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Please provide the following in the order listed:

- The National Johnson O'Malley Association Scholarship Form - **filled out completely and legibly.**
- One full-page letter about yourself: specify your tribe, where you are from, the school you are attending, and your area of study. Describe your educational goals and future plans. Explain why you feel you need this scholarship. Letters should be typed, double spaced, using 12-point font.
- Copy of Certificate of Indian blood or proof of Indian heritage.
- Tuition billing statement from school attending. Needs to list number of credit hours (full-time/part-time status), semester attending, year in school, and tuition amount, or a letter from your financial aid advisor with the estimated costs.
- Official copy of current transcript. Can be issued to student or the school can send it directly to National Johnson O'Malley Association (at same mailing address).
- One page "My JOM Success Story"- Tell us how the JOM funding has helped you to have a successful PreK-12 school experience. You might have received school supplies or have been part of an after school program. Let us know about your success story using JOM funding.
