Friday, December 7	10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30	December Holidays	1-5	Shows how symbols of light and warmth are integrated into the festivities of three families. It helps to renew a sense of the unique beauty of one's own traditions while appreciating those of other people. 15 minutes
