September 3

CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS - Grades 2-8

Presents a lesson in determination as a starry-eyed young man's dream of reaching China ends with the discovery of a new world.

September 12

HARRIET TUBMAN - Grades 3-8

Documents a woman of courage who escaped slavery and then became a modern day Moses, bravely helping to lead others out of chains.

September 19

POCAHONTAS - Grades 3-8

Shows how this Native American princess courageously helped bring an understanding between her people and the early settlers of America. Native American Day is celebrated the last Friday in September.

October 17

LOUIS PASTEUR - Grades 4-8

Shows how with conviction, this great Frenchman discovered the cure for deadly diseases after the death of his beloved daughter.

November 7

WILLIAM BRADFORD: THE FIRST THANKSGIVING - Grades 3-8

Dramatizes how his beliefs and convictions brought peace with the Native Americans, inspiring the first Thanksgiving.

Demonstrates that perseverance was rewarded when the determination of two brothers launched the world into a new age of powered flight.

THOMAS EDISON - Grades 4-8
