Discusses political, economical and historical facts in more depth than the 14 minute middle school version. 21 minutes
Wednesday, January 9	8:00, 10:15, 11:30, 1:00, 2:00	Martin Luther King, Jr./ Black History Month	K-5	Focuses on Martin Luther King, Jr. and his message that America should be a place where everyone should be treated fairly. Covers the turmoil of the 60's and unfair treatment of minorities, events of the Civil Rights Movement, and tributes to King. 15 minutes
Thursday, January 10	9:30, 10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30	Dare To Dream	9	Presents information to prospective college students about locating financial aid. Produced by the California Student Aid Commission. Program may be copied and retained. 12 minutes
Friday, January 11	10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30	The Boyhood of Martin Luther King, Jr.	4-6	Traces the influences that helped mold the life of Martin Luther King, Jr. Emphasizes brotherhood as well as empathy and understanding for those who have endured prejudice. 14 minutes
Tuesday, January 15	9:00, 9:30, 10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30, 1:00, 2:00	I Have a Dream: Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. (Middle School Version)	6-8	Commemorates the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Blends historic motion pictures and the voice of Martin Luther King, Jr., to span the years from the Montgomery bus boycott to his burial in Atlanta. 14 minutes
Wednesday, January 16	8:00, 10:15, 11:30, 1:00, 2:00	Thomas Edison	4-8	Shows that persistence, hard work, and sacrifice catapulted Thomas Edison to become one of the world's greatest inventors. 30 minutes

Friday, January 18	10:00,11:30, 12:00, 12:30	First Moon, Celebration of the Chinese New Year	6-12	Presents information about the Chinese New Year which is "like Christmas, Mardi Gras, Thanksgiving and Easter rolled into one". Begins with the Kitchen God's return from Heaven just before dawn and closes with the lyrical beauty of the Lantern Festival 25 days later. Presented as a gift by Qingdao (People's Republic of China), Sister City Committee. 37 minutes
Tuesday, January 22	9:00, 9:30, 10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30, 1:00, 2:00	Why We Need Each Other: The Animals' Picnic Day	1-4	Shows that although people look and sound different, all are important and need each other. Commemorates Brotherhood/Sisterhood Week. 10 minutes
Wednesday, January 23	8:00, 10:15, 11:30, 1:00, 2:00	Florence Nightingale	4-8	Follows as a young English woman leaves a life of privilege for a life of service, caring for the poor and sick. 25 minutes
Thursday, January 24	9:30, 10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30	New Zebra in Town	K-5	Shows how puppets with very different outward appearances learn the importance of accepting differences. Commemorates Brotherhood/Sisterhood Week. 12 minutes
Friday, January 25	10:00,11:30, 12:00, 12:30	The Klan – A Legacy of Hate in America	9-12	Presents both historical and contemporary information about the Ku Klux Klan. The racist orientation and "attractiveness" of the Klan to certain people is graphically illustrated. It is scheduled to commemorate National Brotherhood/Sisterhood Week so that two dramatically different philosophies can be studied and discussed. 28 minutes
Tuesday, January 29	9:00, 9:30, 10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30, 1:00, 2:00	Preventing Conflicts and Violence	6-12	Looks at how conflicts typically develop and how fights can be avoided. Discourages insults and other disrespectful behavior. Urges kids to find ways of controlling their anger and realize that violence is always a very bad choice. 30 minutes
Wednesday, January 30	8:00, 10:15, 11:30, 1:00, 2:00	Helen Keller	3-8	Tells how, with the help of a patient teacher, Helen was successful in overcoming obstacles of deafness and blindness. 28 minutes
Thursday, January 31	9:30, 10:00, 11:30, 12:00, 12:30	School Bus and the Exceptional Child	K-12	Introduces the bus and the bus passenger, highlighting safety rules, evacuation drills, and the use of seat belts. Produced by LBUSD and may be copied and retained. 8 minutes
