INTERVENTION PLAN**

Intervention Focus:

Focus #1: Computer Resource Instructional Assistant will work with students and staff to supplement the development and implementation of effective instruction of students in all content areas through the use of technology in the computer labs setting.

Focus #2: Two additional recreation aides will be hired to provide additional instruction in the areas of: playground rules, conflict resolution strategies, and physical education activities in a small group setting. When this instruction takes place, classroom teacher is provided with a reduced class size opportunity to be used in ELA or math individualize instruction based on established schedule.

Focus #3: Additional day of counselor will be used to address social-emotion issues of selected students through small counseling sessions, each trimester, which will have a direct correlation to academic/social success to ensure a reduction in discipline issues across the campus and provide resources to families in need.

Focus #4: Bilingual School Community Liaison, 40% FTE, will work with support staff to improve overall attendance and decrease chronic absences as well as work to increase parent involvement through increase communication efforts with families.

Expected Outcome:

Focus #1:

1. Students will make growth in the areas of ELA and math through the use of supplemental tools (technology/websites) and opportunities to use those tools in their learning.
2. Teachers will be able to incorporate supplemental activities using technology to assist students in closing achievement gaps towards mastery in academic areas and improve their knowlege and use of technology.
3. IA will support identified small groups and individual students in the computer labs by providing supplemental instruction when needed.

Focus #2

1. Students will learn to follow playground game rules consistently and apply conflict resolution strategies while engaged in structured and unstructured games.
2. Increase supervision in Common Areas during high volume recess times (AM recess/lunch) to promote and maintain a Safe and Civil campus.
3. Provide a more structured program on the playground to increase engagement and positive school climate.
4. Lower class size in the classroom, during a structured schedule, will allow classroom teachers to provide differentiated instruction in a smaller group setting (ELA/math) which will assist in closing academic gaps towards mastery.

Focus #3

1. Improve student academics and behavior across the school by addressing social/emotional issues.
2. Provide access of resources to families of need in academic, social and mental health areas.

Focus #4

1. Work with support staff to improve overall attendance and decrease chronic absences in order to attain District established attendance goal which will have a direct correlation to academic success.
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2. Strengthen school and home communication by providing additional office support, especially to Spanish speaking families, in the office and for teachers which will increase parent involvement.

They will also work with students to practice the application of conflict resolution strategies during play. Identified Need: All students in grades first through fifth with kindergarten students being built into the schedule close to the end of the year to help with transition to the larger player.

Monitoring: Formal and informal observations of recreation aides as well as classroom teachers to ensure that small groups with differentiated instruction is taking place. Monthly planning tools that include physical education skills; stretching skills and conflict resolution strategies; student/staff surveys
