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8	09/02/2015 06/16/2016	To increase scores on the Entry Level Math Test. The scores on the ELM Test will determine which Math courses students should take to at the California State Universities. 50% of students entering CSUs and UCs require remedial math classes prior to taking college level algebra. With an ELM Test preparation students will be better prepared for the exam. The prep class will allow students the opportunity to practice topics addressed on the exam, and help build their confidence. By participating in the test prep students will be better prepared to do well on the exam. With a stronger test score on the ELM students will no longer be placed in remedial math classes at the CSUs.	Student Achievement Other Student Outcomes

The AP Resource Room serves as an after school study space for AP and Pre-AP students. Some students hold group study sessions and others go in for tutoring. The on-going AP expansion has produced a greater need to support traditional and nontraditional AP students with the increased expectations and rigors of a college level class. We have AP teachers signing up to hold office hours in the APRR, but we do not have enough teachers to effectively provide one on one tutoring services to all students. The after school tutorial program in the library does not currently meet the needs of an AP level student. The AP student tutor program is the ideal choice to fill the needs of AP students (including those that are new to A) requiring additional support. Student tutors are attuned to the academic struggles of their peers, and given that they are successful in their respective AP classes, they can pass on valuable suggestions and strategies to help struggling students.
