- Lexia RAPID - an assessment tool and instructional resource to measure and support reading development and inform reading proficiency

Lexia Core5

- Piloted in schools (e.g. Garfield, King, Lincoln, Signal Hill) since 2015
- Available to all teachers and students, TK-5, in 2018-2019
- Training given to all principals and lead teachers, with sites providing additional training as needed



A Comparison of ST Math and Lexia Core5

ST Math

Students master grade level skills and progress at their own rate; goal is at least 80% mastery by year-end

Students have the ability to complete ST Math at home

All students complete the same tasks which gradually increase in complexity for each skill

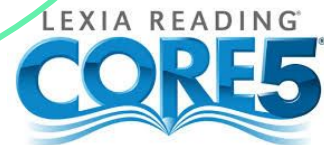


Lexia Core5

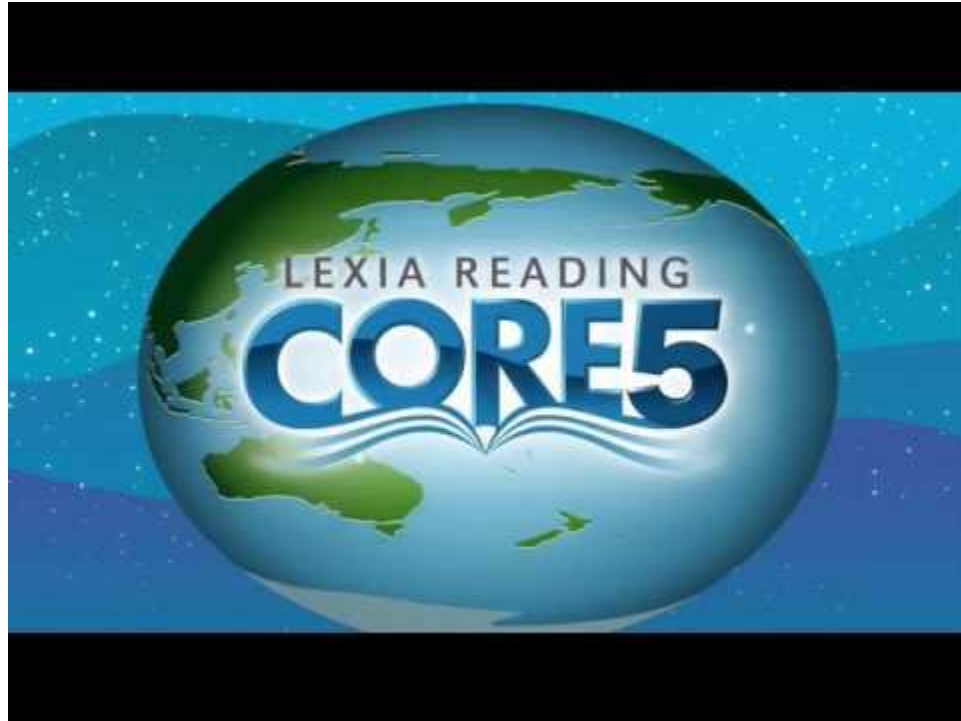
Students take a "placement" assessment at the beginning of the year and progress as their own rate; goal is growth but matched to each student's Core5 reading level

Students should not work on Lexia Core5 at home due to greater role of the teacher and connection to instruction

Tasks are computer adapted and will adjust in complexity based on student responses
