



## **Frequently Asked Questions Regarding Math Bridge Classes and for Incoming 9<sup>th</sup> Graders**

### **1. What do I need to sign up for this class?**

In order to access the online summer school application, you will need your student's ID number and birth date. You will then be asked to complete basic contact information including emergency contacts and doctor information, in case of an emergency. The online Summer School application can be found at

The application will be available starting May 7<sup>th</sup> until May 28<sup>th</sup> at midnight.

### **2. What are the dates for Summer School?**

Monday, June 28<sup>th</sup> to Friday, July 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021.

### **3. What are the hours of Summer School?**

Period 1: 7:50 – 10:15am; Period 2: 10:35 – 1:00pm

### **4. What high school site will my child attend if they enroll in the Math Bridge class?**

They will be enrolled in the high school that they are assigned to attend in the fall if the Math Bridge classes are being offered at that site. If the student is attending one of our specialized schools (Browning, CAMS, McBride, Renaissance or Sato), they will be assigned to the comprehensive high school that is closest to their home residence.

### **5. What if my child is not going to be attending one of the comprehensive high school sites in the fall, can they still attend?**

Yes, they can still enroll in one of the Math Bridge classes. They will be to the closest comprehensive high school to their home address.

### **6. Will my child earn math credit for this class?**

Students will earn elective credit for the Math Bridge classes, as this is a preparatory course it will only receive elective credit.

### **7. What is the benefit of taking this class in the summer?**

The benefit of taking this course during the summer is to get a preview of the content of the course and to gain foundational knowledge to improve your student's success rate during the school year in their math course. Students will also earn elective credit for this class.

### **8. What if I have a vacation planned during the summer school session, can I still enroll?**

If you have already scheduled a vacation during the summer session (June 28<sup>th</sup> – July 30<sup>th</sup>), it is not recommended that you enroll in summer school. There is a very strict attendance policy that only allows for a total of 4 days to be missed during the session, in order to earn a passing grade. If your plans call for your student to miss more than 4 school days, then you should not enroll in summer school.

**9. What is the attendance and tardy policy during the summer?**

A minimum of 85% attendance is required to earn credit. Students will not receive credit if they are absent more than 10 hours (4 days) from a full session course. Each class period missed is equal to 2.5 hours absent and each tardy is equal to 30 minutes absent. Once a student reaches 10 hours of absence in a class, they are dropped from the class.

**10. My student is currently taking Math 8, what class should he/she enroll in during the summer?**

Pre-Algebra

**11. My student is currently taking Algebra I, what class should he/she enroll in during the summer?**

Pre-Geometry

**12. My student is currently taking Geometry, what class should he/she enroll in during the summer?**

Pre-Algebra 2

**13. If my student will be attending Millikan or Wilson during the summer, do they have to wear the required uniform?**

Yes, the uniform is also required to be worn during the summer session.

**14. Will free/reduced lunch be served during Summer School?**

Yes, lunches will be available to qualified students.

**15. What if I am not able to complete the online application by May 30<sup>th</sup>, will I still be able to enroll?**

We highly encourage all interested students and parents to complete the online application by the deadline. If the application is not completed, you will have to wait until the first week of summer school to attempt to enroll. It is very likely that all classes will be full at that time.

**16. Are there any other classes that my incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grader can take besides the Math Bridge classes?**

There will be some additional classes offered for original credit, however the offerings will be site specific. Please check the summer school website to see a listing all courses available at each school site. In addition to classes for high school credit, each site will also be offering non-credit enrichment activities on their campuses. These enrichment classes are also site specific, a list of these opportunities will also be available on the summer school website. Enrollment in the non-credit enrichment opportunities will be done through the high school, please contact them directly.
