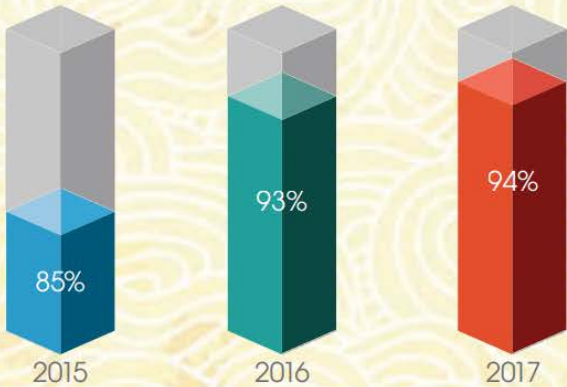

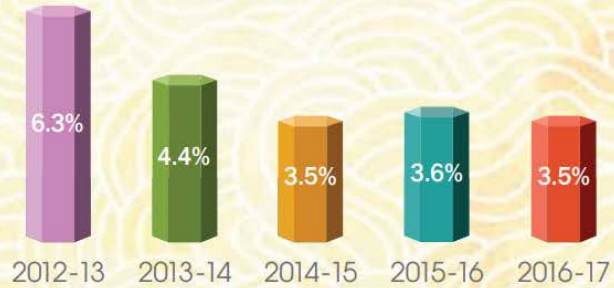
Parent Survey: I feel welcome to participate at this school (Agree and Strongly Agree)



Expand Interventions/ Services

- Offer extended hours of tutoring for ELA and Math, with emphasis on high-need students.
- Provide additional staffing at high-need sites.
- Expand summer programs and dual enrollment.
- Enhance Early Transitional Kindergarten, the Math Collaborative, and library partnerships.

- Support families when and where they need it.



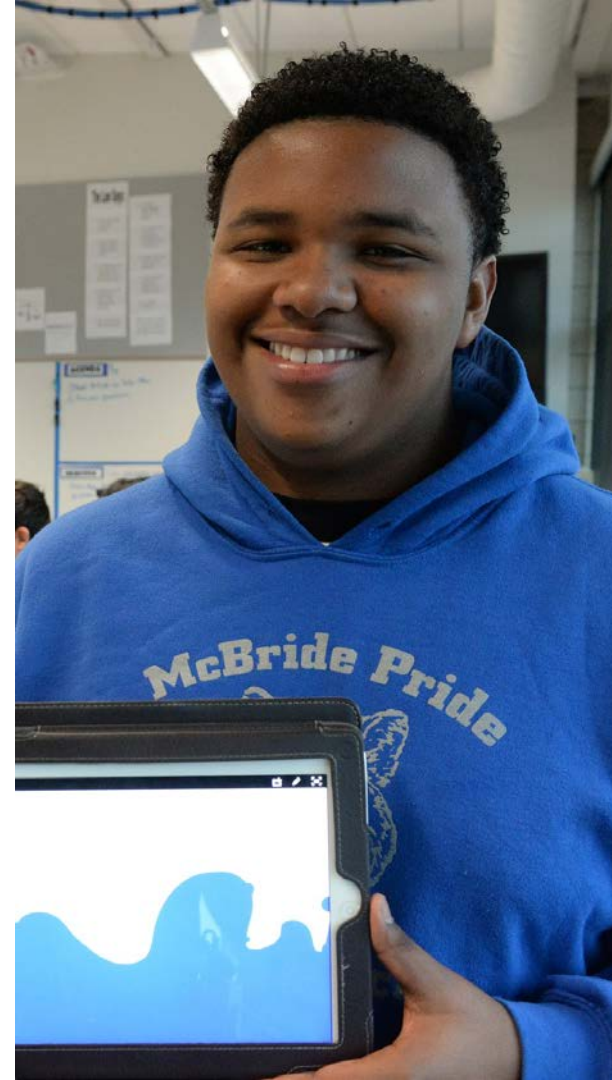
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
