- 7.2 Students analyze the geographic, political, economic, religious, and social structures of the civilizations of Islam in the Middle Ages.
- 7.3 Students analyze the geographic, political, economic, religious, and social structures of the civilizations of China in the Middle Ages.
- 7.4 Students analyze the geographic, political, economic, religious, and social structures of the sub-Saharan civilizations of Ghana and Mali in Medieval Africa.
- 7.5 Students analyze the geographic, political, economic, religious, and social structures of the civilizations of Medieval Japan.
- 7.6 Students analyze the geographic, political, economic, religious, and social structures of the civilizations of Medieval Europe.
